## **Inclusion Audit (Pupils with Additional Needs)**

We have recently been audited by a School Improvement Partner for the Local Authority, who looked at pupils in classes and found the following:

- School Leaders have developed the quality of teaching to enable pupils to be included successfully in lessons
- 2. Teachers plan effectively to remove barriers to learning
- Teaching Assistants have a good knowledge of pupils individual needs
- 4. Pupils could talk about their learning and they felt listened to by staff
- 5. Pupil behaviour was good
- 6. School leaders ensure that all staff receive relevant training
- 7. There is a steadily improving trend of pupils making good progress
- 8. The assistant head teacher has had a significant impact on inclusion


