

Requests for Withdrawal from Learning

London Meed parents and carers are aware that permission for absence in school time can only be granted in exceptional circumstances. We do always need to receive requests for holidays in term time, but do be aware that we share this information with the Local Authority who can decide to apply a Fixed Penalty Notice, this is a fine of £60 per parent per child. Absences in May and June are the most difficult for teaching staff to manage because this is when annual assessments take place, so please do everything possible to avoid absence during these months. National Tests take place for pupils in Y6 during the week beginning 9th May and we need 100% attendance during that week.

Inset Days 2017-2018

We know that parents/carers are thinking about holidays for next summer. We have set our Inset days for the next academic year. You will note that two Inset days are either side of the October half term and two Inset days either side of the May half term to give parents/carers an opportunity to take a longer holiday. Look after the vulnerable

- If you are concerned about your own health or welfare or that of others, please alert the emergency services.

Winter Colds

This is the season for coughs and sneezes. It is important that our youngest pupils know how to prevent the spread of illness, so if your son or daughter comes out of school with a runny nose; please make sure they know how to blow their nose; throw away the used tissue and wash their hands using soap. Helping your child to see these actions as a sequence will help minimise the risk of infection in your house as well as at school. Please do provide your child with a packet of tissues to keep in their pocket to use. If we believe children to be too unwell to be at school we will advise you of this, but coughs and colds can usually be managed at school, provided your child can do the above.

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

<u>Norovirus</u>

Norovirus, also known as the winter vomiting bug, is the most common stomach bug in the UK. NHS Choices, in collaboration with the Food Standards Agency, has put together information to help schools and parents understand Norovirus, from detection to prevention.

Because the virus is highly contagious, children who have Norovirus symptoms must remain off school for 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea to stop the spread of infection with other children or staff.
