Haircuts for Short Hair and School Shoes

Many parents consider haircuts prior to returning to school and we all appreciate this. We emulate secondary schools, who state nothing below a 'number 2' clippers and no extreme styles - dye, tramlines, Mohawks – which are also not suitable in a primary school. Footwear are school shoes suitable for active play in black, not trainers. Parents appreciate everyone sticking to an agreed code, because otherwise pester power starts. If your child says 'so and so wears trainers/has tramlines in his hair', you'll know that is not permitted!

Bikeability

We offer Bikeability in Year Six and this course is free at present, with specialist trainers running an approved course. Every year, we have a few disappointed children who are either not sufficiently proficient at riding a bike, or with a bike identified as unsafe. The sooner you can help your child ride a bike, the greater the benefit in terms of independence on transfer to secondary. The course is really valuable in teaching road sense and is essential for children wishing to cycle on the road without an adult.
