### Behaviour - When the Adults Change, Everything Changes:

Every couple of weeks, we will give you little nuggets to think about in relation to behaviour. This one is all about Positive Noticing:

'You get more of the behaviour that you notice most. This isn't a magic trick or a positive thinking self-delusion. When you notice the good stuff and tell people about it, you change your child's thinking. Catching your child doing the right thing is more impactful than catching them doing the wrong thing. Practice switching your focus this week.'

Remember, there are also monthly live events you can attend online. There is an hour-long 'Behaviour Book Club' session, hosted by Charlotte Clarke from When The Adults Change, online at 8:00pm on the last Thursday of each month - Thursday 23rd October for this month. ### Is your child to ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, when they're unwell.

There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about health protection and managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. Pupils shouldn't miss school on a precautionary basis and can normally attend with a mild cough or cold, unless they have a fever or diarrhoea or vomiting.

We would like to remind you that medical appointments should be booked outside of school hours where possible. If this isn't possible please bring your child to school before and return after if they are well enough.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to inform the school office, by 8.45am, via the absent line answerphone on the main school number 01444 232336 or the StudyBugs app https://studybugs.com/about/parents . Please let us know your child's name, class and reason for absence. If your child is well enough to come to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.






