### **School Adviser Visit**

A local authority audit took place this week and the following is taken from the report provided: "There were clearly high expectations across the sample of books (English, mathematics, Science and Humanities) in relation to: attitudes to learning, challenge, review and self and peer assessment; Books demonstrated that teachers plan a wide range of meaningful and engaging activities to motivate and engage children across the curriculum subjects; Teachers develop, consolidate and deepen children's knowledge, understanding and skills. They give sufficient time for children to review what they are learning and develop further;

Teachers identify and support children with their misconceptions, intervening quickly to help them to improve their learning;"

### **Children's Mental Health**

We provide children with three simple messages to support good mental health and these are:

•Eat a healthy diet

• Have enough sleep (turn off screens 1 hour before bedtime)

• Do enough exercise - at least 60 minutes every day Building self-esteem also builds resilience, so find a reason to praise your child

boars and mostly sows. In a small room, there were sows with their piglets waiting for a couple more. In the next section, they were piglets who were over 4 weeks old


but there were without their mothers. We didn't know they left their mothers at just 4 weeks old.
