Dear Parents/Carers,

Local Authority Audit

We await an Ofsted inspection, but I wanted to share some feedback following a day's inspection which was carried out by three senior advisors from West Sussex in January.

- The quality of teaching has improved since the last inspection.
- Pupils say they feel safe in school and parents agree. The system for checking in visitors is robust.
- Middle leadership in core areas is developing effectively and is having a positive impact on the quality of teaching and pupil outcomes.
- The whole school focus on writing has meant that the quality of pupils' work has improved.
 More able pupils have opportunities to explain their choice of words and phrases.
- Teachers undertake regular assessment of individual pupils to ensure they move quickly through the phonics programme.
- (In Mathematics), pupils respond well to marking and the teacher's challenge.
- Pupils behave well at London Meed. In corridors they are polite and courteous and say they would thoroughly recommend the school.
- (In the Early Years), the environment both indoors and outdoors provides many opportunities for children to engage in selfinitiated activity and children were seen to move confidently through the environment.

Child Protection

All volunteers as well as staff members have to go through a careful checking process (DBS) before working with children and receive information as to what to do if they are concerned about a child's well-being. Parents consultation evening

Thank you to teaching staff who were able to accommodate the occasional double bookings made by our website provider and apologies to parents who were inconvenienced in this way. I hope you found your consultation useful and informative and again, gratitude goes to teaching staff for working an extremely long day to meet with you.

....at the end of the day

Please leave the playground promptly when collecting your child(ren). Meetings for staff start when school finishes and we are unable to guarantee the safety of pupils after they have been dismissed from class. We are experiencing some resistance because children have been told by staff to join their parent or carer and exit the playground and yet some parents or carers are saying that children can stay. There is a public park very close by, so please use those facilities to promote healthy exercise and continued socialisation for your sons and daughters. If you wait on the KS2 playground for older siblings to be dismissed at 3.15pm you are required to supervise younger or pre-school children very closely, because our playground equipment is designed for those aged 7 years or older and is used entirely at your own risk.

Pupil Mobiles

Please be aware that we have changed our system for collecting mobile phones at the beginning and end of the day because previous arrangements took too long. From now, pupil mobiles will be collected first thing in the morning and placed in a locked cupboard in the office until the end of the day, when they will be returned to classrooms ready for dismissal from class. You do need to be aware that mobile phones are provided at the discretion of parents and we cannot accept liability from loss or damage to them. Pupil mobile phones are not permitted in classrooms and playgrounds during the day and a sanction may be applied if your son or daughter forgets to hand it in. The use of a mobile phone in school lessons or at playtime is strictly prohibited and a sanction would definitely be applied in this circumstance. Our e-safety policy is available on our school website should you require further information.

School Funding

School Budgets have been in the news recently. Our budget for 2017-2018 will be reduced in comparison to that received in 2016-2017. Parents can respond to the National Funding Formula (the link is in the attached letter called 'parents covering letter'). If you can spare some time responding to this consultation, using the information supplied in the 'parent response', this could be really powerful. Thank you for your support.

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
Get Caught Reading Photographic competition
