### World Book Day Thursday 3rd March

World Book Day is rapidly approaching so we wanted to take the opportunity to give you an idea of the key activities that will be happening during the week at London Meed.

- Rather than dressing up, this year all members of the London Meed school community will be asked to decorate an item to bring into school, showing an aspect of their favourite book or story. For example they could choose a paper plate, potato, pebble, wooden spoon, shoe box, lolly stick, paper lantern, pillowcase, t-shirt, or poster, decorating it with characters, themes, or parts of the story itself the more imaginative the better! We will then have a competition with a prize for the best item per year group.
- There will be a Book Fair during the day and after school on Thursday 17th March. This will be run by the Book Nook (a fantastic children's book shop in Hove). Further details regarding this will be sent out nearer the time.
- Each class will conduct book battles during guided reading lessons starting during the week of World Book Day. The best battle for each class will be shown in key stage assemblies on the following Thursday. Children will be set this for home learning in advance to prepare for .

- A 'Shelfie' competition will be held with the winning entries being put on display in the entrance foyer. A 'shelfie' is a photo taken of a child with their favourite books from their book shelf. The books can be arranged in imaginative ways, or the photo can be taken in an unusual place. The last time we ran this competition we had photos ranging from children sitting on thrones made of books to a child in their bathtub, bathing in books. Again, the more imaginative the better!
- Each class will visit the library for a story time during the day.
- During the day of 3rd March all learning will focus around book talk and learning linking to one particular book.
- We will send out reminders about these events nearer the time, but please speak to a member of staff if you have any questions.

#### Message from WSCC regarding E-scooters

In recent months, it has been brought to our attention that there is an increasing number of individuals riding e-scooters on the public highway, pavements and in public open spaces, often causing a nuisance to other road and pavement users.

E-scooters are a relatively new mode of transport and as such the Government is trialling various schemes and developing the guidance around their safe use. However, (at the time of writing this letter) many are still unaware e-scooters are classed as 'Personal Light Electric Vehicles' (PLEVs), which means they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements such as:

- Driving licence
- Insurance
- Number plates
- Lighting
- Brakes
- Type approval
- Road tax
- Crash helmets etc.

Without these, e-scooters cannot be used legally on the road and certainly not until legislation has been put in place. In no circumstances is it legal to ride on an e-scooter with a passenger(s) and is considered extremely dangerous. The illegal use of an e-scooter, on the public highway or pavement, is considered a criminal offence and can potentially bring about criminal proceedings. The Government is currently trialling the use of approved rental e-scooters as environmentally friendly modes of transport in some specific locations in the UK (find out more here: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/e-scooter-trials-guidance -for-users). Only approved rental e-scooters may be used in the Government-led trial areas, in line with specific terms of use. For the rest of the country, under current law, e-scooters can only be used on private land. The police are obliged to take action against anyone who is caught repeatedly using an e-scooter illegally or in a way that causes a nuisance to others. In these circumstances, the police have the power to seize the e-scooter under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act/165 of the Road Traffic Act. There will be more and more police presence in the coming weeks and months specifically targeting e-scooter users in West Sussex.
