Dear Parents/Carers,

At the start of the day...

Staff are busy preparing for the day ahead before school, so we have advised our administrative staff that while we are happy to make appointments for after school, we need to dissuade parents and carers from interrupting lessons which start very promptly first thing in the morning at 8.45am.

Safeguarding

After half term we will be introducing new safeguarding measures at drop off and pick up times.

- Main internal doors will be kept to one way at all times.
- All visitors to reception to report in first instance to small hatch. If you have a prior appointment/arrangement with a member of staff or for example collecting a sick child, you will be asked invited in and asked to sign in on our Inventry screen.
- No parents/carers are allowed to access the school via the playground doors or by another means.
- Any post/forms etc. to be put in post box outside main entrance doors or given to children to hand to their class teacher i.e. trip/club permissions slips.

Use of phones on the playground

Some schools are putting up posters on school sites: 'greet your child with a hug, not a phone'. Sometimes our staff say that parents forget to say hello to the son or daughter they have collected because they are distracted by texts or calls happening at the same time.

<u>UK Government and Parliament</u> <u>Petition Increase funding for schools</u>

Schools are having to make difficult choices on how to spend their limited funding as their income has not kept pace with the rise in costs since 2010. All schools are working very hard to "make ends meet" but this is becoming increasingly difficult and verging on almost impossible.

As funding has become tighter, some schools have had to cut back on services like:

- · Teaching and non-teaching staff
- Support for more vulnerable pupils
- Small group work for children who are not thriving in school
- Teaching resources (parents being asked to pay for books and materials)
- Subject choices in secondary schools
- Range of activities for primary pupils
- Extra curricula activities provided free or subsidised
- Repairs to buildings
- Renewal of equipment
