Welcome back

E Safety

At Safeguarding Training on INSET day, many teaching and non-teaching staff expressed concern about the frequency with which children mention the sites above. There is a good deal of helpful information on our website, but above is a snapshot of the suitability of commonly used social networking sites. Adverts and information sharing by the above sites assumes these ages, so if your child does experience difficulties, it is a good idea to assume that the form of communication is unsuitable for them. Children as young as Year Three have also mentioned playing 'Call of Duty', so if you have an older sibling in the house gaming, please ensure your younger child is not watching or playing. Webcams should not be used in children's bedroom areas and playing games online, with other gamers who are not known in the 'real' world should take place under parental supervision (eg in a shared area of the house rather than a bedroom). <u>Sugar</u>



Did you know that the maximum amount of sugar children may eat per day is 5 teaspoons between 4 and 6 years, 6 teaspoons between 7 and 10

years and 7 teaspoons for the rest of us? Please look at the sugar content of cereals commonly eaten in your house to make sure the maximum amount, intended to be eaten throughout the day, is not eaten before school starts.
