This week our Year 4 pupils have been taking their Multiplication Check tests and our Year 1 pupils are taking their Phonics Screening Check. On Monday our Year 2 teachers received a visit from the Local Authority moderation team to validate their judgements for the reading, writing and mathematical attainment of their pupils. The visit was extremely positive and the assessments were agreed to be accurate.

Staffing update

At the end of this term we will be saying goodbye to two of our teachers: Sally Walker and Faye Parker.

Mrs Walker began her career at London Meed in 1990 and will be retiring from teaching this summer. As well as a class teacher, she has been our Music Subject Leader and over the years, has given so many children a love of music and the arts through her weekly Choir and production of plays and concerts. She will be very sadly missed but I know she already has a holiday booked for September. Ms Parker is getting married and relocating to London. She joined our school in 2013, initially as a Learning Support Assistant and then as a class teacher. Her ability to see the best in every child and make them enthusiastic about their learning has made her an asset to our teaching team.

We have two new teachers joining us in September: Jade Pritchard and Chloe McConnell. They attended the INSET day on Monday and spent time getting to know our staff and our curriculum. 
Book review by Grace 40


