- Hate Crime Statistics: The House of Commons Library has published a briefing paper looking at hate crime in England and Wales using figures provided by the Crime Survey of England and Wales and the Police Recorded Crime Series. The briefing paper presents data on hate crime rates per 100,000 population in each police force area and for each hate crime strand: [Link] As you can see, racially and religiously motivated hate crime rose sharply after the 2016 EU referendum and in fact Sussex is ranked at 20 out of 42 in terms of the total number of hate crime offences (across all strands) in 2018/19.
