## **Year 2 trip to Arundel Castle**

Year 2 had a fabulous trip to Arundel Castle. The children took part in a mock battle and explored the moat, turrets and battlements as well as the keep. They showed marvellous manners and listened extremely well. We enjoyed lunch outside due to lovely weather.





## Our new Therapeutic Behaviour Approach and Policy:

We spent a lot of time last year training in a therapeutic behaviour approach. As a result, we have introduced a new policy, which is attached, that all school staff work to. This includes the use of a graduated approach, therapeutic tools to support those children who might find behaviour tricky, and an understanding of Childhood Adverse Experiences, which may include trauma and attachment. This is a working document, as we are also taking part in a year long project on behaviour called, 'When the Adults, Change, Everything Changes'. You will have seen some new aspects such as our daily 'Meet and Greet' and the children may have come home talking about the Recognition Board. This has replaced the 'sun and clouds' or 'traffic lights' that were in each class. Each class now has a Recognition Board where the teacher introduces a class behaviour for everyone to work on, and as they see them achieving this over the day, their name goes onto the Recognition Board. We have also introduced three new rules instead of our golden rules, which are 'Ready, Respectful, Safe'. We have introduced these to the children and we are asking all of our school community to use these. Alongside these, we have also introduced Wonderful Walking, Legendary Lining Up, Terrific Tidying and Marvellous Manners. We are introducing restorative conversations for when children's behaviour is not within our three behaviour codes. As recognition for those children who always do the right thing and follow our behaviour codes, they get chosen for Hot Chocolate Friday.

We are committed to teaching positive behaviours and supporting your children to meet our high expectations. Our inclusive learning environment has been created by adult behaviour that is both strong on boundaries and big on heart. We are delighted that the work we follow in school has been made accessible to families, and over the next few months we will be sharing some ideas in our newsletter. There are also monthly live events you can attend online. There is an hour-long 'Behaviour Book Club' session, hosted by Charlotte Clarke from When The Adults Change, online at 8:00pm on the last Thursday of each month. 



You can leave a message on the absence line 01444 232336 or report their absence on the Study Bugs App

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, please let their teacher know via their year group email address.
