Pupil Premium Funding	You and your family could be entitled to financial support for the FSM grant. This support pays towards hot school lunches and food vouchers, school trips and uniform and can make a huge difference to those families with financial difficulties. Who's in Charge? is a 9 week child to parent violence (CPV) programme aimed at parents whose children (age 8-18) are being abusive or violent toward them or who appear out of parental control. The structure of the programme consists of eight sessions with a two-month follow up. The programme is both educational and therapeutic, we will discuss the causes of CPV, give strategies to help you gain back control and support you throughout the process of change.
