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Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome, The Orchard

Teaching and support staff have really enjoyed getting to know our youngest pupils, who are settling happily. Thank you for getting your son or daughter into school for 8.50am and do telephone us if your child is either absent or late, so we know how to complete the register. Please alert grandparents or other carers to term dates and ensure your child only misses school if they are too unwell to attend.

Have a good morning

If you experience any difficulties getting your son or daughter into school, please consider the following:

- Children have enjoyed the summer break or 4 years before starting school - in a relaxed environment with loved ones
- He/she missed you (or their baby brother, or the dog) yesterday and is worried about feeling that way again
- 3. She/he is worried about you or wants to do what you are doing
- 4. S/he might not have completed home learning, cannot find their PE kit (or does not enjoy PE, or some other aspect of school)
- 5. He/she may be tired

If your son or daughter does not seem to look forward to school, talk to their teacher in the first place. Sometimes children give selective highlights and their teacher may be able to give a fuller picture. If you'd like an appointment to see a teacher before or after school you could simply ask at drop-off or pick-up, or email into office@londonmeedprimary.co.uk, giving an indication of a convenient day of the week and possible time. Do be aware that teachers do have meetings planned after school at times.

Support at Home

We want all children to read with an adult at least four times weekly for 10 minutes a time; even fluent readers benefit from reading aloud and discussing an aspect of a book/character/plot/setting with an adult.

Lost Jumpers

Children decide they are warm and remove sweatshirts all around the school, lunch boxes and water bottles are frequently left on tables in the hall or in the corridors. We aim to re-unite property if there is a name on it, but this is almost impossible if items are not named. This is especially true of 'special toys' brought to school in a pocket, which are unlikely to have a name on. Please regularly check all your child's belongings to check their name is on it, because

sometimes someone else's jumper is brought home by mistake. Similarly, if your child has a toy you cannot remember purchasing, please return it to school.

Packed Lunches

If you would rather your child did not eat a hot meal every day, they can, of course, bring a packed lunch into school. Please pack these in a suitable container, clearly labelled with your child's name and class. Although there is access to water, it is a good idea to include a drink of water or fruit juice. No fizzy drinks, bars of chocolate or sweets though please. Do also ensure that packaging is easy for your child to open. We have a number of children with nut allergies so we insist that you do not include nuts, including peanut butter, in your child's lunches. Nutritional guidelines are for children to have two servings of fruit and/or vegetables in their packed lunch (for example; pepper strips, cut up apple, washed berries, carrot sticks are popular choices).

Sports Clubs

We have had a successful start to our sports clubs this week.

Remember that you can still sign up to RMA football clubs (boys and girls) for KS1 and KS2 online at their web page.

If any parents are interested in volunteering to help with an after school club, please get in touch. No experience is needed; however, you will need to have a DBS check if you don't already have one. Teachers will run the clubs; however, an extra pair of hands means that we may be able to extend numbers within clubs. We have had an overwhelming interest in the hockey and cross country club this term and we have waiting lists. If your child has signed up to a school club and does not attend for 2 weeks in a row, without having informed a teacher or the office of extenuating circumstances, their place offered to the next child on the waiting list.

We are aware that some children will have been disappointed not to get a space in a club, therefore if a club is full, we will re-run the sign up process in the Spring term and those children not allocated a space this term will be put to the top of the list next term, and guaranteed a space. The rest of the spaces will be allocated on a first come first serve basis.
