#### Covid

We have seen an increase in pupils and staff testing positive for Covid over the last couple of weeks. It has definitely not gone away! If your child is showing signs of Covid the NHS recommend that they take a lateral flow test(these can be purchased from the high street shops or online). If it is positive, the current NHS guidance is for children to stay at home for 3 days. They can return to school after 3 days as long as they do not have a temperature and they are well enough.

Wednesday morning was so exciting as children had a taste of the next phase in their education. We welcomed several nursery schools and parents of pupils starting in September. Our Year 6 pupils spent the day at their secondary schools this week and had lots of stories to tell us about the canteens.
