As you can see there is much to celebrate here because he recognised the effective action being taken in order to make the biggest differences to pupils' outcomes. ...at the end of the day

Please keep younger brothers and sisters within sight at the end of the day, because they can feel 'lost' really quickly. Our school is a safe environment for our pupils, but we do expect them to be under parent or carer supervision before children are in classrooms and once dismissed by the class teacher. The equipment on the Key Stage two playground is designed for use by over 7 year olds, so if you choose to allow younger children to use this area this is under your close supervision at all times.

Car Parking

Always a controversial subject! Please make sure you communicate to EVERYONE who collects your child that our staff car park and the street outside the school entrance is not for use at drop-off or pick-up times. It places children in danger when vehicles move. This is often uncles/aunties/grandparents/family friends, so please let them know about the free parking at Queen's Crescent (the voucher is attached with the newsletter so you can pass this on to visitors). From 8.10.18, the car park gates will be locked between 8.30-9.10am and between 2.30-3.30pm in order to keep children safe on our site. Please enter via the main entrance and turn left for pedestrian access.

National Child Measurement Programme

Parents are consulted prior to this national programme taking place – usually in the summer term. Although we have fewer parents who agree to their children participating (only 87.9% of London Meed parents agree to participation, as opposed to 96% of parents nationally), our outcomes in relation to height and weight are good. School staff are not made aware of individual pupil results. If you would like to encourage your child to be more active and/or eat more healthily, a good first place to start is the Change4life website. Miss Griffiths, in her capacity of Sports Lead, does much to ensure playtimes are active, but the government recommends that children have a further 30 minutes of vigorous activity after school too.

October is Black History Month

Our focus is on recognising and knowing the contribution of people of colour, both now and in the past. If you would like to encourage your child research the achievements of people like Harriet Tubman; Mae Jemison or Katherine Johnson, that would be super.

Reporting absence

At London Meed we use an efficient and secure system for reporting your child's absence due to illness, called Studybugs. If you haven't already, please get the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child's ill and unable to attend school.
