Arrival at School

The gates to the playgrounds open at 8.30am and the doors into school at 8.45am. Please ensure that your child has enough time to take off coats etc and be in their class promptly at 8.55am as lessons start immediately after registration. Late arrivals interrupt valuable lesson time.

Bad weather

I would like to outline the procedures should the school need to be closed either outside or during normal school hours, for example as a result of adverse weather conditions.

Closure outside of normal school hours

A decision on school closure will be made as early as possible and will be announced in the following ways:

- On the school website www.londonmeedprimary.co.uk.
- A single text message and email on each morning that the school is closed (based on the data held on SIMS to the main parental contact).
- On the following local radio stations: Heart (96-107) and Bright FM (106.4)

Updates would then be provided during the day as necessary on the school website.

Closure during normal school hours

Staff and pupils will be informed and further information will be provided to a wider audience e.g. parent, locally community by similar means as those outlined above.

The procedure for pupils will be:

• All pupils will remain in school until released by a member of staff.

Holmesdale Entrance

Please park responsibly, this includes not parking over people's drives or covering the white lines which mark the footpath entrance to the school from Holmesdale Road. It is everyone's responsibility to keep our school community safe.

Phonics Workshops

Miss Griffiths provided 2 workshops for parents of children in The Orchard. This provided some theory on the teaching of phonics, as well as an opportunity to engage in learning alongside their children in classrooms. Feedback was really positive and parents now want the same experience for mathematics. A tiny minority of parents who attended said they wanted termly catch-ups on progress. We already provide this through parent consultation evenings in Autumn and Spring terms, with an annual report in the Summer term so you know how your child is doing, and an open door policy, so please do not hesitate to make an appointment if you'd like even more information about your child in school. Thank you very much to Miss Griffiths and Mrs Cobham for arranging this opportunity.

Fundraising

Thanks to your generosity last term, we raised £189.61 for the Poppy Appeal through our Poppy sale. From the retiring collection at our KS2 carol service we raised £87.50 for St John's church and £87.50 for the Auditory Verbal UK.

Nits and Head-lice

Please check your child's hair for head-lice and eggs this weekend. Head-lice are dark and show up more easily on blonde hair while eggs are white and show up better in dark hair. Look around the nape of neck as well as on the crown. You don't necessarily need expensive lotions, just masses of cheap conditioner on wet hair and an adult thoroughly combing sections of hair from root to ends, with a nit comb. Metal nit combs are much better than plastic because the teeth are closer together. If you do find either nits or eggs, LONDON MEED PRIMARY SCHOOL

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you need to repeat this process every day for 2 weeks in order to catch eggs hatching at every stage – and repeat the conditioner and combing with everyone in your household. It is good practice to comb in this way every two weeks anyway, just to ensure your son or daughter is not habitually inflicting nits on other children. If girls or boys have hair long enough to tie back it should <u>always</u> be tied back and plaits are the best anti -nit hairstyle. Nits do not usually jump from head to head, they simply crawl when the hair touches someone else's head.
