Dear Parents/Carers,

Vehicle Movement

In order to keep children safe at our school, please can drivers refrain from pulling up on the pathways surrounding the entrance to the school. The school zig-zag marked area is a no stopping and no parking area to provide safety for our community.

Participation in PE

We are following national guidelines about promoting healthy activity and schools have been directed by the government to provide every child with encouragement to have at least 30 minutes of physical vigorous activity during the school day. There is a government expectation that this is increased for each child to 60 minutes a day with a vigorous activity after school such as; swimming, going to the park, bouncing on the trampoline, bike rides or walking to school etc. This is on top of PE provision of two hours each week. In the rare event that medical opinion prevents your son or daughter engaging in physical activity, we need a note from you, stating exactly what the medical advice is in relation to how many days it is anticipated restrictions to apply. An old-fashioned note is better than an email into the office, which might not be read by a class teacher until first break.

Before and after school

Please keep an eye on your child. We don't allow children to climb fences, gates, or to stand on the very top of the KS1 play equipment during the school day. We would appreciate parents reinforcing this when supervising children on the playground. We are proud of the safety of our school site during the school day, but children need to be reminded that pre-school siblings can be knocked over by other children riding scooters and their own safety is compromised by climbing on gates and equipment not permitted during the school day.

Textile Bank

Our clothing bank is situated in our staff car park by the KS1 playground. Please fill it up because we will receive an income based on the weight. We expect it to be emptied every three weeks, but don't leave things that don't fit into it, because we have to pay to have our regular refuse collected. The clothes bank takes paired shoes, clothes and textiles – thank you.
