

Dear Parents and Carers,

In contrast to last week, this week we have had almost a full staff team and children have been delighted to welcome back their teachers and Learning Support Assistants. The Department for Education have issued guidance for the "next steps for living with COVID-19": 1. Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature 2. Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend 3. Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.

As you are probably aware, this week has been Test Week in Years 2 - 6 and I have been very impressed with the positive attitudes shown by so many of our children. The purpose of Test Week is to equip children with the skills they need as they progress through our education system which uses testing to measure progress and attainment. Importantly for us, it highlights gaps in teaching and learning which teachers can then plan to address. Our staff are very sensitive to the needs of individual children and lots of discussions take place before the tests to ensure that they are all supported to achieve their best. The resilience of the children has really impressed me.
