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Author of the week –4 Thomson



We are 4 Thomson! Jamie Thomson is an award-winning British author who was born in Iran, in 1958. Thomson grew up in Brighton, where he attended Brighton College.

After graduating from the

University of Kent, Thomson began his writing career as an assistant editor of a magazine and also wrote articles for another magazine. Between 1984 and 1996, Thomson began to write books and became a best-selling author, who published at least two titles a year. During this 12-year period, he specialised in fantasy and sci-fi books, which he is now famous for, with most of the books being choose your own adventure books for the famous 'Fighting Fantasy' series. Some children at London Meed may have even read some of these exciting stories. 4 Thomson are currently having their own quest through one of the books in the 'Fighting Fantasy series' (called 'The Warlock of Firetop Mountain') and so far it has been



epic! Nowadays, Jamie Thomson has moved on from choose your own adventure books and now specialises in writing funny fantasy and sci-fi books for children. His most well-known series for children is the 'Dark Lord' books. These books are

very humorous and he even won the prestigious Roald Dahl funny prize for the first 'Dark Lord' book in 2012! These books about an evil overlord who is transported from his mythical fantasy world, where he is an evil king, into the human world in the form of an ordinary teenage boy! There are currently 4 books in the series with the first one being released in 2011 ('Dark Lord: The Teenage Years') and the most recent coming out in 2017 ('Dark Lord: The Headmaster of Doom'). 4 Thomson were lucky enough to read half of the first book in the series before the January lockdown, which we all thoroughly enjoyed and found hilarious! As well as being a famous author, Jamie Thomson has also developed and written the story for many famous video games set in fantasy worlds. He is currently working on a new online MMO game called 'VulkanVerse', where he is one of a team of authors writing the backstory for the game.
