Current Year 3 Parents only - residential meeting:

We are holding a meeting for current Year 3 parents to tell you all about the Year 4 residential on Monday 7th July at 3.30pm. It is a good chance to find out all about it, especially as we are changing the venue. As we have to make the first payment in September, we will need parent's decisions about whether their child is going to attend in September.

Grandparents Day:

On Wednesday 9th July, we will be inviting the children's grandparents to come into school from 2.45pm to 3.10pm. It would be great if they could bring something from their childhood to share with the children - a toy, photograph or book etc. For those children with siblings, we will send the older sibling down to the younger siblings class.

Water Day:

On Thursday 17th July, we will be holding Water Day. Each year group will get a 30 minute slot in the morning to take part. We will have some bins and buckets filled with water as well as hoses with sprinklers. Your child will need to bring in either swimwear or something they are happy to get wet in and a water gun. The water gun must be no bigger than a 30cm ruler - no super soakers. The children will then have 30 minutes to soak each other and the staff that are taking part. If you have a long hose we can borrow and any spare sprinklers, that would be brilliant. We also ask for any children to bring in spare water guns for those children that don't have any or to save squeezy bottles that the children can use instead. We do have a dry area for any children that really don't want to take part.

We are noticing some of our younger children are taking their tops off as soon as they come out of school. Please can we ask that children keep their clothes on until they have left the school premises. Thank you.

Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. If you do keep your child at home, it's important to notify the school <u>on the first day before 9.20am</u> to let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason. You can leave a message on the absence line 01444 232336 or report their absence on the <u>Study Bugs App</u>

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, please let their teacher know via their year group email address.


