## Easter Holidays

## **Attendance at School**

The Department for Education has an expectation that children will attend school 95%+ of the time. Head teachers have very little leeway to authorised absence and now have a duty to report to the local authority when a child misses more than 5 days of school, unauthorised, in a ten-day period which means a Fixed Penalty Notice can be applied. There is a leaflet about this Fine, which is administered by the Local Authority (and does not benefit our school), which is available online https://www.westsussex.gov.uk/educationchildren-and-families/schools-and-colleges/schoolattendance-behaviour-and-performance/schoolabsences/#fixed-penalty-notices or through our school office. In more positive news, 100% attendance certificates will be issued at the beginning of next term as usual. Thank you for promoting good attendance.

### **Online Bullying**

Bullying can take many forms and, as part of an antibullying assembly, children occasionally refer to incidents out of school, online. This can be receiving unpleasant or upsetting messages or images and we want children to report these to an adult at home straight away, then to use the 'report abuse' button, then to block or mute the sender. Remember though, that bullying can involve being purposefully blocked, ignored, or excluded from online games. Parents should ensure that all devices remain in a family room overnight, never in the child's bedroom and it is entirely reasonable to check online activity to ensure your child is safe. Your child should know all the people in an online group they are part of - these should never be 'friends of friends', because individuals may not be who they say they are.

## School shoes

Just a reminder to parents and carers regarding suitable footwear for school (in case you notice your son or daughter needs new shoes). ## LMA 5p challenge


