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Key Stage 1 playground:

You are probably aware that the Key stage 1 playground has been really affected by all the rain this year. Unfortunately, this has created a huge amount of mud coming down the slopes and onto the playground. We have had West Sussex out to look at this, as there is nowhere for the water to go and we are constantly battling against overflowing drains and mud. We ask that your child bring in wellies and a coat to play out on the playground in order to protect their shoes and clothes. There is no short term fix for the playground and we would hate to have to close it.

OPAL and collections:

One of the first things we want to get going with is building a messy/mud kitchen. We could really do with some support with this, so if you know someone that would be able to help us build this, please let us know. There will be various projects that will require help, so if you are interested in offering some support, again please let the office know.

We are still looking for as many loose parts items as possible. We need pots, pans, utensils, sieves, colanders and metal and plastic containers for our messy/mud kitchen. We need tarpaulin, pegs, wind breaks, bungees and old sheets for den building. We need buggies, crutches, wheelchairs, wheeled items for our role play alongside hats and bags and old coats (adult size). And then any small world items you may have such as dolls houses, train sets, garages, cars, play mobil, dolls, lego, mobilo etc. If you are thinking of revamping your garden furniture, we would be happy to take any benches, picnic benches, chairs and tables. Before throwing out, check with us as to whether we could use it or not.


