We are intending for children to be outside at break times but they will not be allowed to play ball games and will be encouraged to stay in the shade.

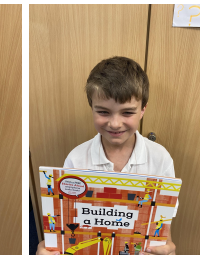
Have a lovely summer break. There will be an INSET day on Thursday 1st September for staff and governor statutory training.
